Village Manager's Report

Family Dollar will be opening soon. I have recently met with the construction manager and various Board members to discuss **job opportunities** for **University Park residents**.

They are seeking carpenters, laborers, drywall hangers, painters, tapers and landscapers. Contact **Project Manager, Jeremy Clinton** at **(630) 595-6200** to bid on these positions.

There will be summer jobs for our youth available through the **Southland Regional Mayors Black Caucus (SRMBC)** and the **Illinois Department of Human Services**. The governor's office has indicated to the **SRMBC** that this year's budget will include \$14 million which includes \$2 million for our group. The jobs program will run from six to 8 weeks, beginning June 24th. We are working on our budget allocations.

The **IDOT** road construction project from **Central to Cicero** continues. **Mayor Covington**, IDOT officials, the Village engineers, Public Works foreman and I meet regularly to keep this project moving forward. The Matthewson Right of Way Company (MROWCO), an IDOT-approved

appraiser, was approved at the March 26th Board of Trustees meeting.

They will work on right-of-way appraisals, title commitments and negotiations necessary to reconstruct the Village portion of University Parkway



between Central and Cicero Avenue.

Interim Finance Director, Joe Jones is making great progress on improving operations in the **Finance Department**. Department priorities remain compiling the budget for the upcoming Fiscal Year, and closing out the FY09 and FY10 financial audits.

We have begun discussions with the **Illinois Department of Central Man-**

agement Services to coordinate with us and the **State of Illinois Surplus Property** department to **receive capital equipment** such as **automobiles** and **tools**. We have the opportunity to acquire these assets before they are placed in the state auction pool, as either donations or for a minimal cost.

I also participated in the **National League of Cities** conference in **Washington, D.C.**, held March 9 - 12. **Mayor Covington**, and **Trustees Elizabeth Williams and Oscar Brown, Jr.** also attended. From Robinson Engineering - Illinois Liquor Control Commission Tobacco Grant Program

University Park has requested funding from the **Illinois Liquor Control Commission** - which develops strategies that reduce the illegal sale of tobacco products to minors.

Also, federal law requires that Illinois tobacco retailers reach an 80 percent compliance rate to minimum-age tobacco laws. Failure to do so can result in the state's loss of **\$28 million** in **Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant** funding from the U.S. Government.

In addition to ordinances already in place, **University Park** is seeking an award to conduct a comprehensive tobacco control program that includes retail education and tougher enforcement of existing tobacco laws.

The Illinois Liquor Control Commission receives \$1 million annually to provide these grants. The Village submitted its application on March 29th.

At the **March 26th Board** meeting, **Trustee Oscar Brown, Jr.** offered congratulations to **Trustee Joseph Roudez, III**, for being honored with a **Certificate of Excellence** award at the **NLC Conference**.



South Suburban Mayors & Managers Association - Complete Streets Workshop

Held on March 21st, the **Complete Streets Workshop**, also sponsored by the **Southwest Conference of Mayors and Active Transportation Alliance**; was designed to enable participants to learn more about effective complete streets polices. That will enable communities to create safe, inviting road networks for everyone, including bicyclists, drivers, transit operators and users, and pedestrians of all ages and abilities.

The **Active Transportation Alliance** created the workshop, held at **SSMMA** offices and attended by about 40 people. During the presentation participants:

- Developed a common understanding of complete streets
- Discussed the benefits of building complete streets
- Reviewed various successful complete streets policies
- Compared complete streets designs and polices

Workshop was designed to engage, mayors and other elected officials, city and planning commissioners. Traffic engineers, public works, roadway design and maintenance staff; as well as transportation, community development and land use planners also benefited.

I participated in several meetings and seminars including: * **National Black Caucus of Local Elected Officials** * **Information Technology Steering Committee** * **The Ethical Leader: Rules & Tools** * **Violence Reduction: Comprehensive Planning & Funding Strategies**.

I also participated in a **Leadership and Delegate's Luncheon**, where **Veteran Budgets** were discussed.



As a longtime employee of the **Veterans Administration**, and the mother of a **veteran**, I am particularly concerned about how the federal budget cuts caused by the **Sequestration** may impact our nation's veterans.

While the **V.A.** and its **\$140 billion** annual budget is protected from the automatic budget cuts that are slashing services in other agencies, **veterans themselves are not**.

This irony has occurred because many of the services most needed by veterans, are not provided by the **V.A.**, but by other federal agencies, that are impacted by the budget cuts. This includes the **Labor Department's Veterans Employment and Training Service**, which offers job training to veterans. It also includes the **Department of Housing and Urban**

ComEd Files Updated Electricity Supply Charges - Almost 30% Bill Reduction Predicted

ComEd has filed with the **Illinois Commerce Commission** its annual update of electricity supply charges, the primary component of the "Price to Compare," which takes effect in June.



The average residential electricity supply charge for customers who buy energy from ComEd will drop from about \$.07/kilowatt-hour to approximately \$.05/kilowatt-hour, a result of almost 30 percent.

"We know that customers are most concerned with their total bill each month," said Ann Pramaggiore, president and CEO of ComEd. Continuing she noted, "Even with the changes, for the next year ComEd customers' bills are expected to be the same or lower than they were a year earlier, because of lower power prices. And because energy prices are low, this is the ideal time to invest in grid modernization."

Can't Find a Job? Might Be Your Credit

The **Village of University Park** will be hosting a job fair on **Thursday, May 2, from 10:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m.** at **90 Towncenter**. Several companies will be coming, in search of applicants to fill a variety of needs, as the economy continues to slowly improve. A recent survey released by Think-Tank Demos reveals

cal debt, also a major cause of bankruptcies.

Although potential employers need permission to view **credit scores**, other information including payment histories and bankruptcies are available, resulting in what is often subjective evaluation and denial of jobs.

The **Demos'** report reveals that about 34 percent of employers use credit checks on some job applicants, and 13 percent conduct them on all applicants. When employers are given permission to run a credit check and base hiring decisions on the result, they are required to tell applicants if information in the credit report is the cause for them not getting the job. It should

be noted that many reports often contain either false or dated information.

The Demo's report recommends that the **Consumer Financial Protection Bureau**, require credit reporting agencies to delete medical information from credit reports. Meanwhile, **Tennessee Congressman Steve Cohen** is sponsoring the **Equal Employment for All Act**, which would prohibit most employers from using credit checks in hiring or firing decisions.

Best advice? Clean up your credit before applying for a job.

Didn't File Taxes On Time? - Don't Panic, But Act Fast

You might be surprised to know that despite the fact that virtually everyone knows that **April 15th** is tax filing day, a surprising number of people fail to file, for one reason or another.

Although in recent years, the **IRS** has re-invented themselves into a taxpayer friendly agency, don't be fooled. When they come knocking on your door, they knock with brass knuckles.

If you didn't pay on time and know that you owe, get in touch and take care of your business. Some are under the mistaken notion that when they are late filing, all they have to do is mail a check for what they owe.

Wrong!

When you miss your date with the tax man, or person, interest and penalties immediately begin to accrue, in addition to your past due tax bill.

Singer **Dionne Warwick**, knows this is true, having just recently filed bankruptcy, while owing the IRS \$10 million in back taxes. According to news reports Warwick has actually paid the original past due taxes. The \$10 million apparently represents interest and penalties that accrued because she paid late. Hopefully her financial and legal advisors have told her that bankruptcy does not wipe out debts owed to the IRS.

While the average person is unlikely to earn the kind of money that will result in \$10 million in past due taxes, it's still better to pay on time.

COMMUNICATE! consulted the **IRS website** for the following information. **What Will Happen If You Don't File Your Past Due Return or Contact IRS?**

Taxpayers who don't file a past due return or contact the IRS are subject to the following:

- Penalties and interest will be assessed increasing the amount due
- The IRS will file a substitute return for you, based on information they have from other sources. Since you failed to file, this substitute return will not include any additional exemptions or expenses you may have coming. It also may overstate your actual tax liability.
- Once tax is assessed the IRS will begin the collection process. This can include placing a levy on wages, or bank accounts, or filing a federal tax lien against your property.
- Even once the IRS has filed a substitute return you should still file your own return. The IRS will generally adjust your account to reflect the correct figures.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Why Should I File My Tax Return as Soon as Possible?

There are two advantages to filing as soon as possible:

1. Generally, if a taxpayer is due a refund, it must be claimed within 3 years of the due date or risk losing the right to it.
2. Self-employed persons who do not file a return will not receive credits toward Social Security retirement or disability benefits.

What If I Owe More Than I Can Pay?

Even if you don't have enough money to pay, returns should be filed to avoid future interest and penalties. The IRS will help set up an **installment agreement** when the situation warrants. Make sure you follow the terms of your agreement.

Will I Go To Jail?

The IRS has a long-standing practice of not recommending **criminal prosecution** for failure to file tax returns; provided the taxpayer voluntarily files, or makes arrangements to file, before being notified that they are under criminal investigation.

The taxpayer must make an **honest effort** to file a correct return reflecting income from honest sources. A letter from the IRS concerning taxes is not a notice that a taxpayer is under criminal investigation.

The IRS helps to get people back into the system as part of its long-term plan to improve voluntary tax compliance. The IRS wants to get people back into the system, not prosecute ordinary people who made a mistake. However, you put yourself at risk if you flagrantly violate federal tax laws.

Just like any creditor, the IRS would prefer that you give them a call, rather than have them come looking for you. For more information call their toll-free number at 1 (800) 829-1040, or visit www.irs.gov.

TIME OUT! BE HEALTHY - LIVE LONGER!

First Lady Michelle Obama has made **children's health** her top priority. And, it might not hurt if adults joined in. As it is, improved and increased medical treatment options are enabling many people to live longer.

However, even with the start of the implementation of *"Obamacare,"* requiring and enabling everyone to obtain health insurance; many people still use the emergency room, instead of preventive care as their first health option in time of need.

The First Lady's *"Let's Move"* program is both comprehensive, yet basic in its' approach. **Her message to parents is:**

- Turn off TV during meals & family time
- Walk with family after dinner
- Plant a family garden

She asks our youth to:

- Move everyday
- Eat more fruits & vegetables
- Drink more water
- Exercise while watching TV
- Help make dinner

Why is the U.S. population so overweight and unhealthy?

Too much sugar. Too much fat. Too many additives. Too much salt.

The result?

Childhood obesity has tripled, with one in three children being obese. In the Hispanic and African American communities it's even worse, with **40 percent** of children overweight or obese.

It doesn't help that in schools across the country many extra-curricular activities, like gym and intramural sports have been cut. And because of the increased risk of violence, some school districts have even eliminated recess!

Add to this the fact that snack portion sizes have increased. Also, one in five school-age children consumes up to six snacks a day. Everything is super-sized, meaning more sugar, salt, fat and calories. And the increasing choices offered by dollar menus at fast food restaurants only add to the problem.

And don't forget, our young people are spending increasing amounts of time watching TV and playing video games.

Recent studies reveal that since 1970 the average American consumes:

- 15 pounds more sugar a year
- 31 percent more calories
- 56 percent more fats and oils

And youth between the ages of **8-18** spend on average **7.5 hours daily** on **entertainment media**, including **TV, computers, video games, cell phones** and **movies**. Only one in three high school students get the recommended levels of daily physical activity.

The way things are going **First Lady Michelle Obama** might want to consider changing the name of her program from **Let's Move** to **Let's Move Some More**.

APRIL - SARCOIDOSIS AWARENESS MONTH

The **U.S. Congress** declared April **National Sarcoidosis Awareness Month** in **2008**. Recognition of this rare disease is supported by a number of health organizations including the **National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute**, the **National Sarcoidosis Association**, and the **Foundation for Sarcoidosis Research (FSR)**.

Google any of the above websites for additional information on this disease.

Sarcoidosis is probably best remembered as the ailment that led to the death of **Chicago-based Comedian** and **Actor Bernie Mac** in **2008**. Although many still believe that **pneumonia** was the cause.

Sarcoidosis though commonly associated with **African Americans**, is a disease that can afflict any ethnic group. The problem? For **African Americans**, it is often fatal.

According to **Nikhil Swaminathan**, writing in the **"Scientific American,"** "The disease - which may infect up to a million people worldwide - affects ethnic groups differently. In 80 to 90 percent of Caucasians who develop it, it simply disappears over time, even without treatment. Meanwhile, in African-Americans, the disease progresses more aggressively, causing more symptoms and resulting in more hospital visits and longer courses of treatment."



What is Sarcoidosis?

It is an inflammatory lung disease, the cause is unknown. But it always affects the lungs first. But, sarcoidosis expert Om Sharma says, *"Sarcoidosis can affect any organ in the body; lungs, skin, eyes, heart, brain, bones."*

What are the Symptoms?

Beware of **"shortness of breath, a dry cough, or an abnormal chest x-ray.** If you get **skin sarcoidosis**, you get lesions of the skin which progressively get worse. Sarcoidosis of the eye results in blurry vision or redness of the eye and pain. Don't ignore the symptoms. They could **progress** to **glaucoma** or **blindness**, according to Sharma.

Sharma continues noting that *"If sarcoidosis affects the liver, then liver function could become abnormal. So, symptoms of the disease depend on the organ involved. But most of the patients have lung disease."*

So, if you develop any of these symptoms be forewarned. Go to your doctor immediately. If tests are inconclusive you might have to seek out a sarcoidosis specialist.

In Bernie Mac's case he was diagnosed with sarcoidosis as early as 1983. Then he came down with pneumonia three weeks before his death in August 2008. He had earlier reported in 2005 that the sarcoidosis was in remission. When he passed, his publicist said the pneumonia and sarcoidosis were unrelated.




