




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COVID-19 Cases Per Day (last 30 days)









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COVID-19 Deaths Per Day (last 30 days)









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COVID-19 Daily Percentage Rate (last 30 days)







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Summary

From the date of the last briefing, which was on June 12th, 2020, the United States experienced about an 11% increase in total COVID-19 cases. Comparatively, the Nation of Brazil experienced about a 34% increase. Cases continue to surge in South America, mainly in Brazil, Peru, and Chile.

In Illinois, we experienced about a 4% increase in total cases since last Friday. During this same time, California seen a 24% increase and Texas seen a 37% increase. Cases in Arizona are also increasing. This is the first week that Arizona has entered the Top 15 Cases Per State.

Chicago and Cook County combine to hold nearly 65% of the State's COVID-19 cases and about 66% of the State's COVID-19 deaths. Other Counties and areas of the State witnessed no remarkable increases in total COVID-19 activity.

It has been about 3 weeks since the larger bulk of protests and demonstrations began in many areas of the country. Here in Illinois, it does not appear that these gatherings directly led to a sharp increase in viral spread. Outdoor venues, nice weather, and masks all helped.

The spikes and surges seen in other areas, mainly in the Southern States, appears to be linked to a combination of delays in or total absence of stay home orders and the subsequent early re-opening of local economies. 15 cases in Florida were linked to 1 gathering of friends for a dinner party.

When viewing the charts, please remember that they represent only the last 30-day period of data. Pay close attention to the vertical column on the left that identifies the quantity or percentage values for each individual chart. These values may change with each briefing update.

Media coverage has shifted to other events and storylines, but COVID-19 remains a threat to public health. Masks and face coverings are making a huge difference! Please continue to wear a mask while out in public and to avoid unnecessary trips away from home.
