General Assessment

I believe we need to anticipate that the State will extend the “Stay Home” Executive Order thru the end of April 2020 at a minimum. Extending current restrictions is reasonable based on the current situation. Social distancing and staying home have helped slow the spread but many people seem to be acting as if these recommendations do not apply to them. People have become complacent and, with the help of the media, are watching this crisis as if it is the latest hit series on Netflix, and not something that will impact them.

The movement of people is spreading this virus. Viruses do not move people—People move viruses. If essential places, such as grocery stores and gas stations, are to remain open, they may have to be called upon to limit the number of patrons in their facilities at a given time to further the goal of social distancing. Interstate travel may also be shifting the problem from region to region. If, for example, the situation deteriorates in Detroit, citizens there may opt to leave for other major metro areas (Toledo, Cleveland).

Since there is no National Policy on response, testing, supplies, and equipment, the States are forced to use free market, private sector companies in attempts to obtain what they need. States are now in bidding wars with each other. The mixed messaging coming from the White House is making the situation worse. Testing needs to improve in terms of speed, access, and frequency. Until we know “how many,” we will never be able to know “how much” we need in the form of PPE, ventilators, etc. The strategy needs to change.
